



We want to start an Engine Maintenance class in January 2024. We have some students ready to take it.


Americas Boating Club is now offering a new online Webinar: Thunderstorms and Severe Weather—Time 1 ½ hrs.

# **DIGITAL SELECTIVE CALLING (DSC)** *What Could be Easier?*

A VHF radio equipped with **Digital Selective Calling**, or DSC, has the equivalent of a "*mayday button*". All new fixed-mount VHF radios come with this one-button feature, which is usually labeled "**DISTRESS**."

When activated, it automatically broadcasts an encoded distress call that will be picked up by all nearby vessels equipped with DSC as well as **US Coast Guards** vessels and their shore stations. If the radio is interfaced with your GPS, it will also automatically broadcast the distressed vessel's position. To use DSC, you must obtain an **MMSI** (*Maritime Mobile Service Identity*) number. Get one at <u>www.USPS.org/mmsi</u>

There are other great features of the DSC radio such as calling or hailing a fellow boater or a group of boaters that might be traveling or fishing together. You can do this as long as you know their DSC numbers, with the push of a button instead of having to hail by speaking into the microphone. For more of an understanding about DSC radios, their features and installation, watch the **BoatUS Foundation** tutorial called, "Can you Hear Me?". Or take one of our seminars on VHF.

But most important make sure your radio has an MMSI # programed into it.

# **12 TIPS FOR SAFE BOATING**

#### 1. Take a Boating Safety Course

New boaters and experienced experts alike need to be familiar with the boating rules of the road. Boating safety courses are offered locally, inexpensive, and often completed in a day,

#### 2. Get a Free Vessel Safety Check

The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and **U.S. Power Squadrons®/America's Boating Club®** offer complimentary boat examinations to verify the presence and condition of specific safety equipment required by state and federal regulations. #### 3. Follow a Pre-Departure Checklist

Utilizing a pre-departure checklist is a helpful way to check the boat and ensure the proper gear is onboard.

#### 4. Be Weather-Wise

Always check local, route, and destination weather and water conditions before departure and ensure it is safe to go out.

#### 5. Use Common Sense

Operate at a safe speed at all times (especially in crowded areas), stay alert, and steer clear of large vessels and watercraft that can be restricted in their ability to stop or turn.

#### 6. Know the Nautical Rules of the Road

Maintain a proper lookout and be respectful of buoys and other navigational aids, all of which have been placed there to ensure your safety and the safety of the boats around you. Check out the <u>USCG's Navigation Rules information page</u>.

#### 7. Designate an Assistant Skipper

Make sure more than one person on board is familiar with all aspects of the boat's handling, operations, and general boating safety, in case the primary operator is incapacitated, and someone else needs to get the boat back to shore.

#### 8. Develop a Float Plan

Whether you inform a family member or staff at your local marina, let someone else know where you're going and how long you'll be gone. A float plan can include the following information:

#### 9. Wear a Life Jacket

Assign and fit each member of your onboard team with a life jacket before departure. Regulations vary by state, but children under 16 and all watersports riders should wear a life jacket on the water.

#### 10. Never Drink and Drive a Boat

Operating a boat while intoxicated is illegal. Nearly half of all boating accidents involve alcohol—designate a sober skipper before leaving the dock.

#### 11. Be Aware of Carbon Monoxide

Maintain fresh air circulation throughout the boat. Educate all passengers about the symptoms of <u>CO poisoning</u> and where CO may accumulate.

#### 12. Stay Clear of the Engine

**Drivers should wear the boat's engine cut**-off switch lanyard at all times. Keep watch around the <u>propeller area</u> when people are in the water. Never allow passengers to board or exit your boat from the water when engines are on—or idling. Take extra precautions near boats towing skiers or tubers.


